**Fuji Electric Co., Ltd.** (富士電機株式会社, *Fuji Denki Kabushiki-gaisha*), operating under the brand name **FE**, is a [Japanese](#) electrical equipment company, manufacturing pressure transmitters, flowmeters, gas analyzers, controllers, inverters, pumps, generators, ICs, motors, and power equipment.<sup>[3]</sup>

## History

Fuji Electric was established in 1923 as a capital and technology tie-up between [Furukawa Electric](#), a spinoff from Furukawa [zaibatsu](#) company, and [Siemens AG](#).<sup>[4][5]</sup> The name “Fuji” is derived from Furukawa's “Fu” and Siemens' “Ji”, since German pronunciation of Siemens is

written *jiimensu* in [Japanese romanization](#). The characters used to write [Mount Fuji](#) were used as [ateji](#).

In 1935, Fuji Electric spun off the telephone department as [Fuji Tsushinki](#) (lit. Fuji Communications Equipment, now [Fujitsu](#)).<sup>[4]</sup>
